Recipes from the Christmas Party

Copper Penney Carrots

Ingredients:

2 lbs thin sliced carrots
1 cup sugar
1 small green pepper
3/4 cup vinegar
1 medium onion
1 tsp mustard
1 can tomato soup
1 tsp Worcestershire sauce
1/2 cup vegetable oil
salt and pepper to taste

Directions:

Cook carrots in salted water until just done. Rinse in ice water. Drain.

Arrange layers of carrots, raw pepper slices and onion rings in 3 quart bowl.

Combine remaining ingredients in sauce pan. Bring to a boil, stirring until thoroughly blended. Pour mixture over carrots and refrigerate until flavor is absorbed, usually overnight.

The longer it sets, the better. Makes 12 servings.

Kale Salad, Festive Style

(loosely adapted from UAF Cooperative Extension) From Eva Cohnen-Brown

Ingredients:

1 bunch kale destemmed 1 lemon, juice of, or 2 Tbs juice 2 Tbs honey Salt - pinch 1/4 cup olive oil (or less) Ground pepper, to taste Pomegranate seeds Apple, chopped Pumpkin seeds, handful - toasted

Directions:

Destem 1 bunch kale, chop and put in a bowl. Use 1/2 lemon juice or 1 Tbs., pinch of salt to 1/8 tsp, drizzle of olive oil over it. Massage 1-3 minutes to relax kale. Massage until it feels tender - different types of kale take longer or less time.

Next, in a bowl mix 2 Tbs honey, 1/2 of lemon juice or 1 Tbs., olive oil 1/4 cup (or less) and ground pepper. Mix well and then drizzle over kale and mix in. If you prefer more tartness, add more lemon juice.

Your submissions are greatly appreciated and make our newsletter what it is - so don't be shy about submitting items for publication.


However, there are a few rules which we all must pay attention to:
